PROJECT BACKGROUND

The Heysen Trail is highly valued by South Australians and the wider hiking community across Australia and internationally. The community benefits of the trail are easily identified; it contributes to individual health, community health, environmental conservation, and regional prosperity through tourism.

Gaps have been identified in the existing management/governance/partnership model of the Heysen Trail.

The intent of this project is to:

1. Explore options for the future governance of the Heysen Trail, and
2. Recommend a 'best practice' model for future governance of the Heysen Trail, with consideration of the unique factors impacting on this trail.

Consultation and discussion with local and regional stakeholders is critical to the success of this Review. You are invited to participate in an in-person regional workshop or an online workshop to provide your input into the development of the Heysen Trail Governance Review.
